Abstract: The collection comprises architectural drawings documenting architectural designs

of Gilbert R. Blount spanning the years 1844-1874.

Biographical/Historical Sketch

Gilbert Robert Blount (1816-1876) was an English Catholic architect active from about 1845 until 1870. He received his earliest training as a civil engineer under Brunel, for whom he acted as a superintendent of the Thames Tunnel works (1825-1828). Employment in the offices of Sydney Smirke (1830s) and Anthony Salvin (1842-1849) preceded his appointment as architect to Cardinal Wiseman, the Catholic Archbishop of Westminster and England's first Roman cardinal since the Reformation.

Blount's years of maturity coincided with the resurgence of Catholic church building in England, a phenomenon initiated by the Catholic Emancipation Act of 1829, which freed Catholics to take an active role in politics and to practice their faith openly. The ranks of English Catholics were also swelled by immigrants: refugees from revolutionary France at the beginning of the century, and Irish laborers fleeing from famine later. The increase in numbers created a pressing need for new churches, and Blount's activity as an architect was almost exclusively in service of this need. His designs and executed buildings are churches, monastic complexes, and related educational institutions for the monastic community.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains a range of Blount's designs for both executed and projected buildings. They include proposals for St. Edward's, Clifford, Yorkshire (ca. 1844-1845), a church and buildings at Crewe (1851-1852), Holy Trinity, Kidderminster (1856), St. Peter's, Bromsgrove (1858), and St. Helen's, Brentwood (1860-1861). The collection is also rich in Blount's drawings of liturgical furniture.

The following projects are not represented in this collection: St. Anne's, Spitalfields (1850) and the Dominican Priory, Carisbrooke, Hampshire (1865-1866).

In processing this collection and preparing the finding aid, the staff of the Architectural Archives have relied heavily on the M.A. thesis by Constance McPhee cited above. A full index to projects represented in this collection is found in Appendix A.
