- Abstract: The bulk of the collection comprises architectural drawings and photographs related to 19 projects by Theophilus P. Chandler and 1 project for Chandler as client. Some projects are notable for personal associations in Chandler's life. The collection also contains a small number of personal photographs and travel sketches. It contains no office files, correspondence or materials related to architectural education. All holdings related to Chandler's commissions for the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Co. are found in the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Collection.

Biographical/Historical Sketch

Theophilus P. Chandler was born in Boston, Massachusetts. He studied one year at Harvard University and later at the Atelier Vaudremer in Paris. He worked in Boston architectural offices until 1872 when he established his own office in Philadelphia. There, family connections helped him to obtain important residential commissions in the region. He is known for his designs for large private houses and churches, but his projects also included housing developments with other architects and developers, speculative houses on his own properties, railroad stations and office buildings for railroad companies that served the rapidly growing suburbs of the region.

Chandler was a leader in architectural education in Philadelphia in the latter part of the nineteenth century. He taught at the Spring Garden Institute in Philadelphia and served on its Board of Trustees. As president of the Philadelphia Chapter of the AIA, he was instrumental in founding the Department of Architecture within the University of Pennsylvania's Towne Scientific School in an effort to reshape the profession in the region. Chandler served as the Department's executive head in 1890-1891.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains architectural drawings, photographs and a few printed items related to nineteen projects by Theophilus P. Chandler and one project for Chandler as client. Projects include residential, ecclesiastical and commercial structures and one mechanical invention, a cable car intended to carry freight and passengers. A number of projects represented are notable for personal associations in Chandler's life, e.g. Chandler's designs for his own country residence at Ithan, Pennsylvania, and his housing development nearby. The collection holds 44 architectural drawings for Chandler's home at Ithan, and a small number of drawings for alterations to his city house and to his office in Philadelphia. Also found is group of drawings and photographs related to several contiguous farms in Chester County, Pennsylvania, which may have been family properties.

The housing developments represented in this collection (at Sharon Hill and at Radnor, both in Delaware County, Pennsylvania) are noteworthy in that Chandler was landowner, housing developer and architect. One house in this collection (at Sharon Hill) was designed for Chandler by another architect, J. Harris Reed of Beverly, New Jersey. There are no materials related to Chandler's collaborations with Robert Copeland in the development of Ridley Park.

The collection contains original drawings for Tabernacle Presbyterian Church in West Philadelphia and prints for St. Peter's Church Parish House, in Germantown. Also found are two modern blueprints made from Chandler's 1889 competition design for the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City.

Personal materials include a portrait photograph of Chandler by William Shewell Ellis of Philadelphia and five less formal outdoor photographs, two labeled "Uncle Thorf" and one labeled "Pa Chandler." Notable also are two travel sketches, a watercolor and gouache rendering of the interior of Salisbury Cathedral (signed "TPC" and dated 1912) and a watercolor view of a lake (signed "TPC" and dated August 22, 1892).

The collection contains no office records and no correspondence. Nor does it contain any materials related to the University of Pennsylvania or any of Chandler's other work in architectural education. All holdings related to Chandler's commissions for the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Co. are found in the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Collection.

Acquisition: The bulk of the collection was purchased by G. Holmes Perkins in 1978 and donated to the Rare Book Room of the Fine Arts Library, University of Pennsylvania. The collection was transferred to the Architectural Archives in two groups, in 1983 and 1988 respectively. Additional material was donated by Coxe Associates in 1978, Mrs. Francis James Dallett in 1984, Andropogon Associates, Ltd. in 1987, and Tabernacle Presbyterian Church (through S. Jonathan Bugbee) in 2001.

Processing: The collection was processed and the finding aid prepared by William Whitaker, Emily Cooperman, Laura Stroffolino and Nancy Thorne, with the research assistance of Matthew Pisarski, Julie Dunn, Lynette Stuhlmacher, Bryn Owen, and Suzanne Kortz. Work was substantially completed in 2001, with additions and corrections in 2003.
