Biographical/Historical Sketch

Italian architect Carlo Scarpa (1906-1978) was born in Venice and educated at the Accademia di Belli Arti, where he received his diploma in 1926. During his 50 years of practice, Scarpa created designs for glass and furniture but is best remembered for his beautifully crafted architectural designs. His masterpiece, the Brion-Vega Cemetery (San Vito di Altivole, 1970-1978), weaves the allegory of life into death throughout every detail into a "wholeness of inseparable elements." His last work, the central headquarters of the Banca Popolare di Verona, is a three story annex to a existing neo-Renaissance banking house. Achieving harmony through contrast, Scarpa's design reveals a convincingly modern approach while maintaining a strong, if individualistic, emphasis on the detail.

Scope and Content Note

The four drawings in this collection document Scarpa's design for the roof terrace and staircase for the central headquarters of the Banca Popolare di Verona, begun in 1973 and completed after Scarpa's death by his collaborator Arrigo Rudi.
