## Biographical/Historical Sketch

Rhode Island architect and author Norman Isham (1864-1943), known for his study and restoration of colonial buildings, was born in Hartford, Connecticut and educated at Brown University. He worked for six years in the Providence architectural firm of Stone, Carpenter & Wilson before he established his own office in 1893. Isham collaborated with Albert F. Brown on two important books, *Early Rhode Island Houses* and *Early Connecticut Houses*. Isham was made a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects in 1913.
