Abstract:	The Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Collection consists of 65 original architectural drawings, 1 contract and 1 specification, documenting thirteen railroad stations and the Company offices on South 4th Street in Philadelphia. These projects were designed between 1859 and 1889 by noted Philadelphia architects: John M. Gries; Collins and Autenrieth; William Lorenz; Frank Furness; and Theophilus P. Chandler.

Biographical/Historical Sketch

The Philadelphia & Reading Railroad, incorporated in 1833, was instrumental to early American industrial development through its dominance of the anthracite coal trade. The Company established a regional passenger and freight network that at its stretched from Atlantic City, New Jersey to Buffalo, New York and from New York City to Wilmington, Delaware. Based in Philadelphia, the Railroad employed many of the city's most prominent architects to provide designs for stations, passenger cars, and ferryboat interiors. In 1893 the Reading Company was formed as a holding company for the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Co. and the Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron Co. In 1924 the Reading Company became the operating name of the railroad. The Reading Company declared bankruptcy in 1971, and its assets were taken over by Conrail in 1976.

Scope and Content Note

The Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Collection consists of 65 architectural drawings, 1 contract and 1 specification, documenting thirteen stations and the Company headquarters on South 4th Street, Philadelphia. This collection has been formed by the Architectural Archives with the hope of better documenting the architectural heritage of this company as well as the work of a group of significant Philadelphia architects, John M. Gries, William Lorenz (Chief Engineer), the firm of Collins & Autenrieth, Frank Furness, and Theophilus P. Chandler. Much of the material included in this collection had been dispersed at the time of the Company's dissolution in 1976 and has been reassembled through donations from several sources.

This collection contains no photographs, correspondence or other office files. The largest deposit of Reading Company records is at the Hagley Museum and Library, Wilmington Delaware.
