Biographical/Historical Sketch

"The French architect Jean-Augustin Renard (1744-1807), Controleur des Bâtimens du Roy just before the French Revolution, won the Grand Prix de Rome in 1773 and spent the years 1774-80 studying architecture in Rome. While there his ability as an architectural draughtsman secured him employment, alongside Fragonard, Pâris and Desprez, in providing drawings for the plates of the Abbé de Saint-Non's celebrated Voyage Pittoresque de Naples et de la Sicile, and his travels through Southern Italy on the Abbé de Saint-Non's behalf must have taken him to Pompeii, then newly fashionable as a destination for the archaeological tourist (serious excavation on the site had only begun in the mid 1760s). At this period Renard was also producing architectural drawings for purposes of his own, partly as part of his course of study in Rome and partly with a view to subsequent publication; on his return to France he was to publish a volume of drawings of architectural detail taken from the buildings of ancient Rome, issued under the title Etudes de Fragments d'Architecture in Paris in 1783..."

Scope and Content Note

The drawings were executed in 1778 while Renard was studying in Rome as a Grand Prix de Rome winner.
