#### Biographical/Historical Sketch

Thomas Sandby (1723-1798) was a self-taught architect, one of the founding members of the Royal Academy in London and its first professor of architecture. His work as an architect is not easy to evaluate due to his restricted practice and the destruction of virtually all of his buildings. Sandby's most significant commission was the Freemasons' Hall, Queen Street, London built in 1775 (demolished 1932). In 1765, Sandby was appointed Deputy Ranger of Windsor Great Park, a post he held for more than 30 years until his death in 1798. There he was joined by his brother Paul (1731-1809), an important landscape painter, who assisted him in the landscape gardening activities that became his principal occupation.

#### Scope and Content Note

The collection comprises four undated architectural drawings for three designs of Thomas Sandby. William Sandby states in his monograph (*Thomas and Paul Sandby*, London, 1902) that the two drawings for a parish church were presumably made some time during the period 1765-1798 for the Reverend George Sandby of Denton, Norfolk. The drawing inscribed "Toll House at Stains Bridge" [Staines Bridge, Middlesex] is placed during the period 1790-1796 by Howard Colvin (*Biographical Dictionary of British Architects, 1600-1840*, London: John Murray, 1978). Little is known about Sandby's drawing of a Palladian façade.
